Together with Revd. Caroline Walker, we guide the children in exploring our FAITH through values that are both Christian and universal, including:

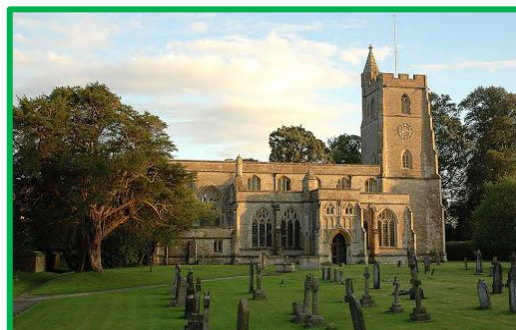

### COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

## Sprites Pre-School

Our preschool is a cherished part of our school family, offering the very best start to each child's learning journey. A particular strength of our pre-school is that children benefit from a qualified teacher from the age of two. This is complemented by a team of highly skilled, qualified and experienced EYFS practitioners, ensuring children receive expert support, high-quality teaching and nurturing care from the very start. Together, this provides an exceptionally strong foundation for children's learning, development and future success.



As part of the school, our youngest children benefit from being part of a nurturing, inclusive community where they can grow, play and thrive alongside older pupils. This close connection helps children feel secure and confident as they move through the school, building strong relationships and a deep sense of belonging from the very beginning.

We believe that every child deserves the opportunity to learn through discovery, exploration and play. Our pre-school embraces a play-based approach that nurtures curiosity, creativity and confidence. We celebrate our Christian ethos while respecting and learning about the many different faiths and cultures that enrich our world. By encouraging children to show kindness, respect and love for one another, we help them grow into thoughtful and caring members of our school community.

One of the greatest strengths of our pre-school is the wealth of outdoor space available for play and exploration. Children enjoy:

## Pre-school Settling in and Taster Sessions

We know that getting used to new people and a new environment is a big step for children and parents. Ensuring your child is secure and happy at Sprites starts with the settling in process. As all children are unique, some will settle quickly and others will take more time to feel secure in a new setting. Once registered, you and your child will be invited to spend some time in Sprites during which they can take part in the normal routines of that day. Parents will be able to share information with us about your child's interests and health needs, as well as any issues of which we need to be aware. We recommend a short taster session with a family member and a longer one, without family. Staff will ensure your child is secure with as much 1:1 attention as they need, to explore and join in with activities and the routines of the day.



## Admissions/Applying for a School Place

We warmly invite families to book a personal tour of our school, allowing time to explore the setting and ask any questions that matter to them and their child.

Children join school during the academic year that they turn five. To apply for a place, an application form must be completed. Starting school applications must be made to the Local Authority. The closing date for primary school applications in England for September 2027 is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2027. Applications are for children born between **1 September 2022 and 31 August 2023**.

If you are looking to change schools or are moving into our area, you are also welcome to visit. In-year application forms are available directly from the school. As we do not have a designated school catchment area, we are pleased to welcome applications from families living at any address, subject to the availability of places.



## Starting School

Traditionally primary schools have offered a staggered approach to starting Reception. After reviewing this and listening to our parents and carers, we have found that many of our new Reception intake are ready and keen to begin full time, from the first day. This may be due to them having been in a nursery or pre-school, prior to joining school. We equally understand that all children are different, and some may benefit from a more bespoke timetable, for a period of settling. We usually find that by half term all our children are happy to be in for full days, but we can be flexible with our entry arrangements to best suit the needs of your child.

We invite parents to a meeting in the Summer Term, before the children start in September. Your child will also be invited into school during the latter part of the Summer Term to enable them to meet their new teacher.

These meetings provide an opportunity for you to tell us anything about your child that will help us care for her/him and enable them to settle into school. This can be an anxious time for parents, so I really want to reassure you that we make every effort to make this transition fun and enjoyable for all.

### Helpful Hints

Sometimes parents worry about how they can best prepare their child for starting school, but it's really very simple. Children take their cues from you – if you talk about starting school as an exciting and fun thing that is a normal part of growing up, your child will respond in a similar vein.

In due course, we will pass on other more specific hints, but for now we would encourage you to be positive about starting school and work on giving your child the gift of independence.

Can your child put on and remove their uniform (including shoes)?

Can they recognise their name on their uniform?

Can they find their own coat and do it up?

Can they use the toilet independently and wipe their own nose?

Can they use a knife and fork to cut up & eat their lunch?

Can they follow simple verbal instructions?



These sound like simple things but can help enormously.

## Our Curriculum – Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

When children join us at age four, they arrive full of curiosity, unique experiences and an incredible capacity to learn about the world around them. Our curriculum is designed to nurture this natural wonder, building on what they already know and inspiring them through meaningful, hands-on learning experiences.

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) provides the framework for learning, development and care for all children from birth to five. It sets out the high standards that ensure every child makes progress and develops the knowledge, skills and confidence they need to thrive. In Reception, children complete the final stage of the EYFS, preparing them for a smooth and successful transition into the National Curriculum in Year 1.

At the heart of the EYFS are **seven interconnected areas of learning and development**, which together create a broad and balanced foundation for lifelong learning. Children learn best through play, exploration, and purposeful experiences – and our approach ensures that every child’s learning journey is joyful, challenging, and inspiring.

The **seven areas of learning** are:

- **Communication and Language**
- **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**
- **Physical Development**
- **Literacy**
- **Mathematics**
- **Understanding the World**
- **Expressive Arts and Design**

We believe every child is capable of extraordinary things. By providing a rich, stimulating environment and nurturing relationships, we empower children to become confident, resilient and creative learners – ready to embrace the challenges and opportunities ahead.

The Class Teacher assesses the children at the end of their year in Reception. This assessment is based on classroom observation - your child won't be tested. The Early Learning Goals are used as a guide and benchmark.

## The National Curriculum

As children move from the end of the Foundation Stage they start to work to the guidelines provided by the National Curriculum to provide an appropriate transition into Year 1 and then on through to Year 6.

Our curriculum has been developed in order to ensure that our children leave us with outward looking attitudes, celebrating similarity and difference between people, places, cultures and beliefs. It has also been developed as a two-year rolling programme that ensures robust coverage and progression of skills for our mixed year group classes.

We are incredibly proud of our students and what they achieve both personally and academically. Our 2025 Year 6 data saw 90% of students pass all areas of the statutory assessments, with 100% passing reading with 60% of those students receiving the highest grade possible. In Maths, 80% of our students received the highest award.

## Special Educational Needs (SEN)

We promote high standards of education for all our children, including those with SEN. Where necessary we work closely with other statutory and voluntary bodies to provide support for children with SEN to fully meet their needs.

## Extra-Curricular Provision



North Cadbury C of E Primary School is committed to providing a rich variety of learning, both throughout the day and through our After School clubs and provision. We include as much as we possibly can through school funding and our very generous PTFA but occasionally need to ask for voluntary contributions.



Clubs and experiences have included, Artist visits, Trips to the Houses of Parliament, Music lessons, termly swimming, Skateboard workshops, Archery club, pottery workshops, to name but a few.

## School Uniform

We are very proud of our uniform at North Cadbury C of E Primary, and I am sure that you will agree we have good reason to be.



The children are all encouraged to take great pride in their smart appearance. We do ask for uniform to be clearly named – believe me it makes life so much simpler when trying to reunite a school jumper with his or her rightful owner!

Sprites Nursery & Pre-School also have a very smart uniform polo shirt and jumper.

We are also very proactive in reusing and recycling preloved uniform, as an important focus for our eco-school status. Please do look out for PTA uniform sales or contact Mrs Hall-Say in the office.

## Uniform Requirements

Footwear – shoes (& winter boots) should be sensible, flat and must be black or navy. Socks or tights should be green, black, grey or white.



Jewellery - children should not wear any additional jewellery to school, including bracelets, rings or necklaces.

The following items of jewellery are acceptable:



Earrings – simple stud or small sleeper earrings

Watches – a plain ‘tell the time’ type watch is allowed. Simple ‘fitbit’ style watches can be worn but we do not allow any devices that connect to the internet or record audio of photographic content.

Hairbands and accessories should be in school colours or neutral colours and of an appropriate size. We ask that children refrain from wearing any form of make-up to school.



## Summer Uniform



Knee-length grey tailored shorts may be worn. Green and white checked summer dresses and white sandals may be worn, however these must strap on (no slip-ons) and have an enclosed toe. In very warm weather we revert to PE kit as our summer uniform.



## P.E. & GAMES

White, black or navy shorts. Green school logo, or plain white T shirt. Trainers or daps – please ensure that these are the correct size and that they fasten properly.



Navy/black joggers or leggings and school sweatshirt or cardigan should be worn on colder days.

# Attendance and Punctuality

## Attendance and Term-Time Absence

At North Cadbury we know that every day in school makes a real difference to your child's learning, confidence and friendships. Children who attend regularly can take part in the full range of exciting opportunities we offer and build strong foundations for their future success.



We also understand that family life can sometimes bring challenges, and there may be times when your child is unwell or when circumstances feel overwhelming. Please know that we are here to support you. By working together, we can make sure that your child has the very best chance to thrive.

## What the Law Says

- By law (Education Act 1996), parents must ensure their child receives full-time education.
- The Government has made it clear that children should only be absent from school in **exceptional circumstances**. Family holidays, for example, are not considered exceptional and cannot be authorised.
- If your child has a significant number of unauthorised absences, schools are required to follow national procedures. This may result in a Penalty Notice (a fine) being issued by the Local Authority.

## How We Can Help

If you are finding it difficult to get your child into school, please talk to us. We want to work in partnership with families to find solutions and provide support. Together, we can make sure every child enjoys school, feels valued and makes the most of their learning.

At North Cadbury, we celebrate good attendance and encourage children to be proud of coming to school every day. Every morning is a fresh opportunity for new discoveries, new friendships and new successes.

## Absence

We understand that there will be times when children are unwell or need to be away from school. If your child is absent for any reason, please contact us by phone or email by **9.30am on the first day of absence** so that we know your child is safe and can record the reason for their absence.

Schools are required to keep detailed records of attendance. Any absences that have not been agreed with the school must be marked as **unauthorised**, and these records are shared with the Local Authority and the Department for Education.

If your child has an appointment, such as with the dentist, letting us know in advance helps us to ensure they are marked correctly for the sessions they do attend that day.

The Government considers attendance below **90%** to be **persistent absence**. If your child's attendance begins to fall towards this level, we will contact you so we can work together to understand the reasons and put support in place. If attendance does not improve, we will invite you to meet with our Attendance Officer to discuss next steps.

At North Cadbury, our aim is always to work in partnership with families. By keeping us informed and working together, we can make sure your child feels supported, valued and able to make the most of every learning opportunity.

## Safeguarding & Keeping Children Safe



At North Cadbury C of E Primary School we are committed to the highest standards of safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all our children and young people. Our school expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. The outcomes of this are that children and young people at North Cadbury feel happy and safe. We aim to provide a caring, safe environment in our school alongside a curriculum in which children's self-esteem and independence are nurtured, as well as developing an understanding of how to keep themselves safe in the community, in the ever-changing wider world and online.

Our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) is myself, Mrs Amy Truett, ably assisted by two Deputy DSLs.



### School Security

It is important that we know who is on our premises. We ask that parents/carers/visitors report to the school office on arrival. If children arrive late, we ask them to report to the office before going through to class. If you would like to talk to a member of staff and they are not expecting you, please go to the main school office.

#### HEALTH & SAFETY

The children are taught about all aspects of safety on a regular basis and we encourage them to take appropriate care in all they do.



# Visiting & Volunteering in School

At North Cadbury C of E Primary School we positively welcome and appreciate input from parents, as we firmly believe that parents, guardians and teachers working together, offering mutual support, helps our children to be happy and successful at school.
