Our Dragon Class

What a fantastic first half term we've had in Dragon Class! The children have settled in beautifully and shown great enthusiasm for their learning.

Our shared reading of *Goodnight Mr Tom* has been a key part of our learning this half term. The children have loved exploring the characters and themes within the story, and it has inspired some truly lovely descriptive writing. We have focused on creating atmosphere and using powerful vocabulary to bring our ideas to life. This linked perfectly with our history topic on World War II, where we have explored what life was like for evacuees and how the war affected families across Britain. The children have shown great empathy and curiosity throughout.



We've also had some exciting visitors in school this half term. The children absolutely loved their cool skateboarding sessions, showing confidence, balance and determination as they tried out new skills. Our hands-on science investigations linked to flooding gave everyone the chance to explore real-life scientific ideas through practical experiment!

As part of our Harvest celebrations, the class wrote some fantastic poems from the point of view of a scarecrow which were full of personality and imagination. They also created beautiful autumn scenes using oil pastels. Their finished pieces were bursting with colour and creativity.

The children thoroughly enjoyed the scooting and skateboarding, showing bravery and encouragement for each other throughout the session! The children have spent lots of time perfecting their self-portrait skills; creating a number of portraits throughout the half-term! These include scarecrow self-portraits which were a great addition to our harvest celebrations.



This week we have completed our History topic on the Stone Age to Iron Age. The children worked hard to combine the knowledge they had learnt in previous weeks enabling us to create a timeline of the whole period as a class.

Hygge This Term With Mrs Hawker

What a long and productive half term it has been!

Phoenix Class have settled well and have been enjoying the many opportunities that Hygge offers to them each week.

This Autumn half term along with the usual quizzes and nature card games, we have been looking at seasonal changes and the transfer of plant dyes and stains and finding out about the famous artist Arcimboldo and Mathematician Fibonacci.

Activities have included making blackberry dough, tie dye using spinach and blackberries and releasing dye from flowers and ferns onto material using tools.

We created our Autumn artwork in stages. Firstly, the children used watercolour paints to create a background wash which was left to dry. The following week the children have used newspaper strips to make tree trunks and glued these onto their backgrounds, used felt pen to define them and finally used acrylic paint to add leaves, mixing colours and using dabbers, brushes and their fingers to apply the paint. The results were individual works of

art.

The children were excited to mix and knead bread dough to create bread rolls and the next day at home time some rolls were devoured before they had left the school gate!

More recently we learned about the Italian artist Giuseppe Arcimboldo, that created art portraits using fruits, flowers and vegetables and created some outdoor compositions and made jigsaws of his portraits.

Everyone has been fascinated to understand about the Fibonacci sequence and learn about the number pattern and nature's code.

Next half term we will be thinking ahead to a festival in December!

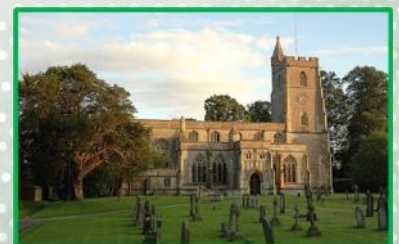

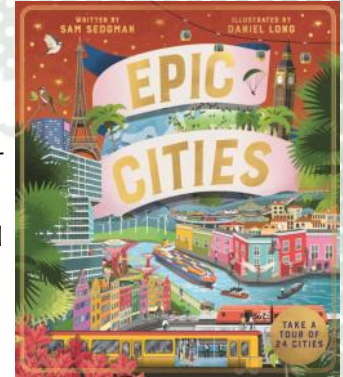


Wells Literary Festival

Attendance and Term Dates

Please find attached the term dates for the 26-27 academic year. I kindly ask that you consider these dates, when planning family holidays.

We know that regular attendance makes a real difference to every child's learning, wellbeing and future opportunities. The government expects pupils to attend at least **95%** of the time, with attendance below **90%** classed as **persistent absence**. While we understand that illness and exceptional family circumstances sometimes arise, holidays during term time cannot be authorised except in **very rare cases**. Schools have a duty to monitor attendance, and where concerns persist, the **Local Authority** may issue a **fine (£60–£120)** or, in serious cases, begin **prosecution**. As the DfE reminds us, *“Children who attend regularly are more likely to achieve and thrive.”* Thank you for working with us to ensure every child enjoys the full benefit of school each day.

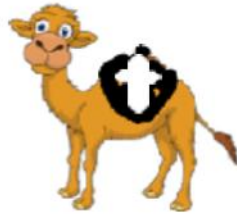

Children's eye health

Your child's sight is precious. Good vision helps them learn, play and communicate with the world around them.



Yet, there are more than a million children in the UK with undetected vision problems (source: Eye health UK)

Children's vision continues to develop until they reach the age of eight, so caring for a child's eyes in the early years can help lay the foundations for good vision that lasts a lifetime.

There are lots of simple things that you can do to help keep children's eyes healthy.

Essential Eye Checks

Having regular sight tests as advised by your optician is a great place to start.

Sight tests will ensure any problems such as childhood conditions like squint and lazy eye (amblyopia), longsightedness (hypermetropia) or short sightedness (myopia) are picked up early.

The sooner problems are identified the better the treatment outcomes.

Remember sight tests are free on the NHS for all children under 16 years or 18 in education or training. If they require vision correction (glasses or contact lenses) you'll be entitled to an optical voucher towards the cost of this too!

In Somerset there is access to reception aged vision screening at school.

Eat a rainbow

Eating a rainbow of colourful fruit and vegetables helps ensure young eyes get the nutrients they need to grow healthily. Food like tomatoes, grapes and blueberries as well as fish, eggs and whole grains are packed with eye-friendly nutrients.



Spend time outside



There is evidence that spending two hours or more a day outdoors can reduce the risk of myopia or shortsightedness, even if there is a history of the condition, so time spent outside can benefit your children in many ways.

Try walking to school, playing outside, sports, PE lessons or going for a bike or scooter ride.

Cover up

It's really important to protect your eyes from the sun. When you're young the lens at the front of the eye is really clear so can let even more of the damaging sunlight in.



Protect children's eyes whenever the UV Index rises to three or more even on cloudy days and check that their sunglasses have a CE; UV 400 or British Standard Mark to ensure they provide the right level of UV protection.

A hat with a wide brim can also help protect against damaging UV.

Limit use of screens

Children should be reminded to take regular breaks whenever they do any intense close work like using a screen or reading a book. There is some evidence that excess screen time can damage vision long term.



A good rule to follow is the 20, 20, 20 rule which suggests taking a break of at least 20 seconds, every 20 minutes and to look 20 feet (6 metres) away.

Teenagers viewing smart phones should hold the screen at least 30cms away from their face to avoid eye strain.

Signs of reduced vision

It's often difficult to tell if your child is having problems with their eyes but some tell-tale signs that there could be something wrong include:

- struggling to recognise colours and shapes
- not showing any interest in learning to read
- complaining about headaches
- sitting very close to the TV.

If you recognise any of these symptoms you should arrange for your child to have a sight test.
